Outreach center launches Project of Hope in Moore

The Carpenter's Table Community Outreach Center, located at 5957 Reidville Road in Moore has launched The Project of Hope. The Project of Hope will provide free Mobile Mammography, prostate specific antigen and cholesterol screenings in the western part of Spartanburg County to residents lacking access to medical treatment.

Funded by a generous grant from the Spartanburg Regional Healthcare System, The Project of Hope seeks to assist people in need that lack access to affordable health services. Undetected health problems often lead to major life crises and even death. Early screening can detect problems which lead to early treatment and ultimately save lives.

The Carpenter's Table Community Outreach Center hopes these health screenings will assist in the early detection of breast cancer, prostate cancer and high cholesterol. ReGen-

esis Health Care, AccessHealth and The Bearden Josey Center for Breast Health will provide assistance to those individuals needing following-up healthcare.

In 2010 The Carpenter's Table Community Outreach Center provided food for over 13,000 people while administering nearly 200 flu shots. Mobile Mammography, AccessHealth and ReGenesis Health Care have committed to partnering with TCT to ensure the success of the program.
